Q: When is the deadline to register for the trip?

Three With Motre Dame Ties Bring Mew Restaurants to the Mautical Mile Brother of ND Grad to open Restaurant-bar

With the new year comes new life to the restaurant scene along the Nautical Mile in St. Clair Shores. **Michael LeFevre** has a new eatery planned. The long time restaurateur plans to open a new restaurant-bar on the grounds of Colony Marina on Jefferson Avenue.

LeFevre believes a new name along the Nautical Mile - the 1-mile strip of Jefferson between Nine Mile and 10 Mile roads that is home to restaurants, shops and parkland east of Lake St. Clair - will attract new attention to the area, which will be good for all merchants. "I've been on this avenue for 23 years; I know how tough it is out there," LeFevre said. "But I've been traveling around the world and I've come up with some new concepts over the years. I'm coming in with some energetic, enthusiastic ideas," he added.

LeFevre certainly knows the Shores landscape. He and his brother, **Tom LeFevre '78**, ran the former Jack's Waterfront restaurant for years before he was bought out in 1994. Tom LeFevre continued with another partner to run Jack's until he sold it last year. That property is now Dockside Jack's.

Michael LeFevre plans to convert an existing 5,000-square-foot warehouse at Colony Marina into a new restaurant that will be similar to Sinbad's in Detroit, with dockside service to boaters coming to shore for refreshments. He "might call the place Mike's on the Water," LeFevre said.

The Andiamo Brothers Diversify Portfolio & Approach to Dining

The largest family-owned Italian restaurant chain in southeastern Michigan is going south of the border to help bolster sales in a difficult economy. *Joe '75 and John '77 Vicari* are expanding a Mexican cuisine concept that by next year will make up more than 30 percent of its Andiamo Group eateries. The Warren-based company has converted an Italian restaurant in downtown Rochester to a Rojo Mexican Bistro and is in the process of converting another one in St. Clair Shores. When Andiamo opens another planned Rojo next year at The Mall at Partridge Creek in Clinton Township, the group will have nine Andiamo and four Rojo restaurants. The original Rojo opened at Novi's Fountain Walk in October 2008.

Rojo's menu offers a range of Mexican cuisine at a "slightly lower price point," said Andiamo Restaurant Group CEO Joe Vicari. "It's a tough economy," Vicari said "You have to be creative," he added.

The Rochester site closed as a "break-even" Italian restaurant in September, opening five weeks later as a Mexican eatery. So far, the restaurant is about "twice as busy," Vicari said. The location records \$60,000 in weekly sales, a 50% increase from the \$40,000 it generated when it was Andiamo," he said.

Andiamo St. Clair Shores is slated to close for renovations in January. The restaurant was losing too much business to Andiamo Tratoria in Grosse Pointe Woods, just two miles away. "We're just beating each other up because we're sharing the same customers and almost the same location," John Vicari said.

There are few sit-down Mexican restaurants in St. Clair Shores, the Grosse Pointes or neighboring Eastpointe or Harper Woods. "The St. Clair Shores location tends to be more lively and because it's on the water, we felt it would be a better location for something new," John Vicari said.

The cost of converting an Andiamo restaurant to the Rojo concept is about \$350,000, according to the Vicaris. They expect to spend \$1.8 million to build the Partridge Creek restaurant, which will open in May or June.

What can you expect from Rojo Mexican Bistro? Guacamole made tableside,

cheese imported from Mexico and the Andiamo credo — "Everything is made from scratch, nothing comes from a can." this concept "separates Rojo from competitors," the Vicaris said. "The restaurant attracts a slightly younger crowd, more interested in tequila than wine," Joe Vicari said. The décor is understated, with contemporary furniture done in deep reds and oranges. "We took the P.F. Chang's approach, where it (the restaurant) could be anything," Joe Vicari he said. "We don't have a sombrero on the wall," he concluded.

The concept for Rojo originated with the Mexican fare that chef Luis Garza would make to feed Andiamo employees before the Italian restaurant opened for business. The enchiladas, tacos and spare ribs Garza cooked showed the Vicaris how diverse Mexican cuisine could be. Chef Garza is now a partner in Rojo.

One major change, other than menu and décor, that customers will need to adjust to is in regards to the popular Mille Grazie dining rewards card. It will not be accepted at Rojo. The Vicaris plan to roll out a new rewards program specifically for the Rojo chain. The Rojo St. Clair Shores location is scheduled to open February 6, 2011.

Jim Riebl's Friendly Honda Gets Complete Remodel

Jim Riehl's Friendly Honda just finished a complete remodel, and the Clinton Township dealership is celebrating its "all new look." That's how Jim Riehl III '03, general manager, describes it. The renovation began over the winter and finished in September. "It's state of the art — a big difference from what it is to what it was," Riehl III said. The Honda dealership now "has the freshest and newest look in the Metro Detroit area," he added.

To mark the occasion, Friendly Honda did soem special promotions. Riehl III stated that "15,000 direct mail pieces were mailed throughout the area announcing the grand re-opening and an open house featured hors d'oeuvres and the chance to win prizes. The mass mailing included a special number, which if it matched a corresponding scoreboard, mailing

recipients won something. The big prize was a three-year prepaid lease on the 2011 Honda CRZ, but the promotion also included smaller prizes, GPS devices, swag featuring Friendly Honda's mascot - an English bulldog named Rocky, and other goodies. Two 2011 models are being featured, the Honda Odyssey - one of the top-selling minivans and the new Honda CRZ Hybrid Sports Coupe.

Before the renovation, the showroom was shared brand space. The remodel now has it exclusively Honda, with the Cadillacs moving to the site's Hummer building, since Hummer is no more. Riehl III says there are "plenty of nice perks for customers to enjoy." There's a drive-up lane for service that works like a valet. Pull up, have the service guys write your

order and take the car back and work on it. Customers can wait in the improved lounge and watch television on a large flat screen. They have also added a room where kids can play. It's not just the lounge that's improved. "The whole place is

bigger," Riehl III says. "We really opened the building up to make more

free space" and pretty much everything is as new as the 2011 models in the showroom. "The whole redo cost about \$800,000," Riehl III said, adding that all the contractors hired were local. "The remodel was really a big deal for Honda," he says, adding that the manufacturer has pretty much wanted it done since the Riehl family bought the dealership in 2001, when it was Mitchell Buick.

Building things up is always a good sign, but Riehl III says there was a slump for a spell. The business "took a beating" on the Honda side because it's an import. Some people would even come in to the showroom and tell them they didn't want to buy a foreign car. "Maybe it's a foreign brand, but 70 to 80 percent of a Honda you buy was built in the United States," Riehl III said. "Honda keeps building more plants in America, pumping \$2 billion into the U.S. economy," Riehl III added.

Business is starting to rebound. And father Jim Riehl, dealer principal, agrees. "We're starting to see light at the end of the tunnel." Jim Riehl said.


Trophies




