

'63 Grad Pens Book About Baseball's Leadoff Mitters

Herm Krabbenhoft '63 is a retired research chemist. He spent his career researching polymer chemistry and plastics for General Electric at their research and development facility on in Schenectady, NY. Since retiring in 2001, he has plenty of time to pursue his other passion - baseball research. In 2006, his first book about baseball was published by McFarland. Entitled Leadoff Batters in Major League Base*ball*, it is a book about the one subtlety that can make or break your team - the leadoff hitter. It covers the men who have taken that position and how they have performed in this important role over history. The book is a great reference work covering the major leagues' leadoff batters for more than 160,000 games from 1900 through 2005. Broken into five parts, the book covers the annual records of the leadoff hitters, principal leadoff batters by team and top career leadoff batters, composite statistics for those players with five or more principal leadoff batter seasons, leadoff home runs, and an essay section on assorted leadoff batter achievements, such as RBIs, runs scored, and awards and honors. ... continued on page 9

ND Grads Leading Area Football Teams '82 Grad Gives Shorians Something to Cheer For

Tom Iwanicki '82 has instilled a winning culture at St. Clair Shores Lakeshore. In just four years, he has led the Shorians from wondering if they'd win to expecting to win. In 2005, his first season at the helm, Lake Shore went 1 - 8, but the players bought into the system and knew the future of Shorian football looked bright. "We've been growing since day one and the players are the biggest reason," said Iwanicki. He has instilled in them a work ethic and sense of personal responsibility. "Every group of Senior football players has made it a priority to work hard, be an example to the younger players, and try to be positive leaders within the school community," said Tom. Tom credits his former coaches at HWND for giving him the foundation needed for success in coaching. "I've been blessed to learn under some great Hall of Fame football coaches," said Iwanicki, "Bob Lapointe at ND, Ray Barr at Fraser, John Maltese (HWND'78), and Roger Swijak - I would like to thank them, as well as my ND coaches Al Baumgart, John Rinaldi, and Brandon Oliver for teaching me the game and most importantly, how to help young players mature into good, decent adult members of the world." With the foundation set in the 2005 season, Iwanicki's Shorians gualified for the state playoffs in 2006, going 6-4. In 2007, they fell one game short of qualifying for the state playoffs, finishing with a 5-4 record. The 2008 season has seen the Shorians make a return to the state playoffs for only the 3rd time in school history. "We've qualified for the playoffs for the second time and led Lake Shore to three consecutive winning seasons - the... Continued on page 2

first time since 1982," said Iwanicki. A head coach can't do it alone. Parental involvement has been instrumental in the success of his program. "I revived the parent support group (QB club) which helps with fund raising and provides the team pre-game dinners," said Tom. A head coach is only as good as his staff and Iwanicki has a good one. "I have an excellent staff that has been with me for all four years," he said. Tom credits them for the success of the Lake Shore program. "Pat Dailey, Will Puvalowski, Lloyd Slabaugh, Angelo Plouffe, and Joe Bongiovanni they've taken my vision and have run with it," Iwanicki said. Tom Iwanicki has a great team with senior leadership that is poised to make a long run in the state playoffs.

Capac in Good Mands

Tom Manney '82 is enjoying his 21st season of coaching high school football. "Coach Bob LaPointe gave me my first coaching job at ND," said Manney. "I coached ND's freshmen with Tom Iwanicki and Jim Cali--Both still coaching," he said. Tom has spent the last 11 seasons coaching at Capac, the last two as head coach. He has also held the head coaching jobs at Cardinal Mooney and Detroit St. Hedwig. Manny has incorporated a new weightlifting program to ensure his players are better conditioned to finish games. Commitment to the weight room has put his players in better shape. "They know how we seemed to fade in games in the past," he said. When asked which season has been most rewarding, Manney replied, "This season stands out the most for me because my son is a senior on the team." Tom has coached his son's class of players "since they were in the seventh grade." Coaching your own son in any sport is definitely a very special opportunity. "It will be very hard to say goodbye," he said.

'63 Grad Leads Rival to Best Football Season Ever

"It reminds me of the glory days of N.D. Football," Paul said when asked about the program he has built at Warren De La Salle. "I guess Bazy (legendary coach Walt Bazelewicz) taught me a few things about the game," he said. After a slow start in the beginning of the century, De La Salle football experienced a rebirth with the hiring of **Paul Verska** '63 as head coach. With Verska (2002-Present) at the helm, the Pilots made an impressive 6 game turnaround from the 2001 season, finishing 8-4, winning the school's first ever MHSAA District title in football and giving hope for the future. Verska led the Pilots to another playoff appearance in 2003, then experienced some turbulence as his football team

went through two consecutive 4-5 seasons. Then, in 2006, he guided De La Salle to a break out season when De La Salle again qualified for the state playoffs. The 2006 season saw the Pilots defeat all of their league foes for the first time since 1994. The football team won their first ever MHSAA Regional title with a win over Birmingham Brother Rice in the USA Today National Game of the Week, and their first ever MHSAA Finals appearance in what was arguably the most exciting MHSAA State Finals game ever. The Pilots came up short in their bid for the school's first ever state championship, but their run in the 2006 season set the standard by which future De La Salle football teams would be judged. Verska's 2007 De La Salle football team appeared





poised to make another run at a state championship as the Pilots won each of their first 6 games. Unfortunately, injuries took their toll on the team as they finished 6-4 with a disappointing loss in the district semi-finals against Rochester Adams. "Coaching at De La Salle is awesome," said Verska. He has coached at 7 different high schools and "DLS is the best of both worlds," he said. "Academics and athletics go hand in hand here." 2008 could prove to be **THE** season for De La Salle football, as Verska has led the Pilots to an 9-0 start and its first Catholic High School Central Division Championship since 1994. Verska has led the Pilots to their 3rd Prep Bowl appearance in 7 years, this time winning the championship in a come from behind victory over Catholic Central at Ford Field. DLS will be making their 5th state playoff appearance under Verska's leadership. "Our team is blessed with many Indians and no chiefs," said Verska. "Every member of this team has contributed to our success."



As I stated in the Preface -- "Some years ago (in the autumn of 1984), noted baseball researcher Bill James wrote the following: 'Rickey Henderson is one of the greatest players in baseball, one of the most exciting players in baseball, and possibly the greatest leadoff man in the history of baseball.' No comparative information was presented to support the phrase, 'the greatest leadoff man in the history of baseball.' When I read that statement (in 1987), several questions jumped out at me -- First, was James' assertion consistent with the baseball record? Second, if the claim was accurate, then who was the greatest leadoff batter in MLB history -- before Rickey Henderson. Next, since (at that time) Henderson was a junior circuit player, who was the greatest leadoff batter in the American League -- before Rickey Henderson? And, fourth, who was/is the greatest leadoff batter in National League history? Casey Stengel said, 'You could look it up.' However, a thorough check of the baseball literature revealed that there was NO substantive information on leadoff batters -- who they were and how they performed. If I wanted to find out the answers to my questions, I would have to conduct a comprehensive research effort. So, that's what I did, starting back in early 1988." For each decade from 1900 forward. I examined the boxscore (as presented in The New York Times or The Sporting News) for each game for each season and recorded the leadoff batter for each team along with his at bats, runs, and hits. So, over the course of some 16 years I pored over hundreds of reels of microfilmed newspapers and checked

out the boxscores of some 160,000 games. I then put everything together to write the

What inspired you to write Leadoff Batters in Major League Baseball?

Do you plan to do any more writing?

Yes. I'm working on two books focused on the Detroit Tigers. One is Tigers Uniform Numbers -- i.e., the uniform number(s) worn be each Tigers player in each season from 1931 (when Detroit first used uniform numbers) forward. There are a lot of very interesting stories to help bring the "dry" numbers to life. The other book deals with certain statistical achievements in consecutive games -- i.e., consecutive games (a) getting a hit, (b) getting on base, (c) scoring a run, (d) batting in a run, and (e) producing a run (i.e., either scoring a run or batting in a run). With regard to other works published, I've published my baseball research in several magazines/journals/newspapers (e.g., Baseball Digest, Baseball Weekly, Baseball America, The Sporting News, the Baseball Research Journal, The National Pastime, The New York Times, the New York Daily News, etc.) [I've also had numerous publications and patents on my chemistry research.]

How was Notre Dame instrumental in your career success and in your writing?

Mr. Ron Cook was an outstanding chemistry teacher -- really helped make chemistry fascinating. With that starting point, I pursued chemistry in college and became a research chemist. With regard to my writing, I'll credit Mr. Cosky (my freshman "English" teacher) with giving me a good start in effective, grammatically-correct, no-nonsense writing.

How were you able to get the book published by McFarland? I provided them with a summary of my research. They then asked me to write the book.

Who are your favorite authors?

I've read -- and re-read numerous times -- all of the Sherlock Holmes stories by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle. Similarly, I've read -- and reread numerous times -- Mark Twain's Tom Sawyer and Huck Finn, as well as many of Twain's other writings. I've also read -- and re-read -- many books on shipwrecks in the Great Lakes (by several authors).


