Iwanicki '82 Uses Support to Turn Lake Shore Into Perennial Power

Lake Shore football coach, Tom Iwanicki '82, has become a fan of musical theater.

Over the past few years, Iwanicki has seen "Beauty and the Beast" and was in the audience for "South Pacific" and "Grease."

In fact, whenever a Lake Shore football player performs in an extracurricular activity, Iwanicki or another coach likely will be there, whether it is a basketball game, a swimming meet or a school play.

"I try to go to everything," said Iwanicki, who is in his fifth season as the Shorians' head coach. "You always try to make an effort to go to at least one. You try to sit there and be there for them."

Iwanicki believes that the attention to players goes a long way toward building a successful program, just like getting the players to get committed to the weight room and an offseason workout regimen.

So far, the results are hard to argue.

After a 1-8 2005 campaign, his first season, Iwanicki has guided the Shorians to four straight winning campaigns. And with a 7-2 regular season record this fall, Lake Shore has earned a playoff berth for the third time in four years. Before Iwanicki's arrival, Lake Shore had never advanced to the postseason.



"Obviously, it starts and ends with the kids," Iwanicki said. "When you have great kids, that does wonders. It makes good coaches out of us all."

"The second thing is consistency with the staff," he said. "Most of us have been together for the last five years. It's been really nice that philosophically we're on the same page offensively and defensively."

Pat Dailey has served as the team's defensive coordinator, and Will Puzalowski has called the plays on offense during Iwanicki's tenure. They have turned Lake Shore from a program that had just five win-Tom Iwanicki '82 ning seasons from 1980 to 2005 into one with playoff aspirations each season.

This year, the coaching staff has clicked with an experienced squad headed by 17 seniors, including leading tackler Deontae Bridgeman and Danny Carroll.

"As a whole they've just been very diligent in how they prep for things," Iwanicki said. "They're very competitive."

Zach Sienel leads the team in rushing for a Lake Shore team averaging 32.8 points per game, and junior quarterback Ray Borkowski gives the Shorians' nohuddle offense an extra dimension.

"He has the ability to change plays at the line," said Iwanicki, who compared Borkowski to Peyton Manning because of "his gyrations" at the line of scrimmage. "He's almost given full autonomy. If he sees something, he can change it, as long as he can come back and justify it to us on the sideline."

The coaches have come to believe in Borkowski, just like he has come to believe in them.

That's why this winter, if Borkowski plays basketball or acts in a school play, Iwanicki likely will be there watching.

"I think it's just like having a security blanket," Iwanicki said. "If they know you're behind them, if they know you're going to support them through the good stuff and the bad stuff, I think that helps them relax and play. If they know you care... I truly believe the kids will do anything to repay the trust."





'97 Grad to Expand Family Business

Owners of a Polish market in Hamtramck are planning to build a new \$2.5million complex in Sterling Heights. Radoslaw (Rodney) Srodekwith '97 and family plan to open a market, restaurant, microbrewery and a food production and distribution business to supply restaurants and markets in Oakland and Macomb counties.

Srodek's Market plans to build on a nearly 2-acre vacant site on the west side of Mound, south of 18 Mile. as soon as final plans are approved. The Srodek family plans to continue to operate its original business, which started in 1981, on Jos. Campau in Hamtramck.

"We're making it easier and accessible for our clients and customers. We have a lot of them out this way," Srodek, who handles marketing management and sales, said of Detroit's northern suburbs.

The location is on a busy thoroughfare and is either in, or close to, communities where Poles migrated from Hamtramck. The area has other Polish markets, Polish churches and American-Polish clubs and centers.



The proposed one-story complex would have more than 15,000 square feet and include up to three spaces for other businesses.

He said the restaurant would have an outdoor patio and that Srodek Deli and Bakery would move from Mound and Hall into the market, which would be called Srodek's. "It's going to be bigger and better," he said of the site that would sell authentic family recipes.



The site is expected to have 20 employees when it opens and possibly up to 50 in the future, City Planner Don Mende said. "It's a unique mixed-use type of development, kind of a little niche we haven't seen before," he said.

Srodek said the business has been planning to expand for 15 years and was looking for the ideal location. The complex is expected to take eight to 12 months to build. "It's going to be a destination point as well as a restaurant," he said, "an attraction with great food."
